WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This one-day, practice-based NTC-sponsored workshop will offer participants the opportunity to work with the presenters to explore the narrative theories and concepts of re-membering and ongoing relationships put forth by Michael White and Lorraine Hedtke, as well as discuss some experiences and ideas based on using these practices in a counselling setting. In the afternoon, we will have the opportunity to not only participate in a live interview, but also deconstruct the interview/discussion to gain a better understanding of how to implement these practices outside of the workshop. We will explore possible roads to take and questions to ask to both introduce the idea of, as well as be curious about, on-going relationships between a client and a loved-one who has died. This will provide means to enrich the therapeutic experience beyond the traditional grief and bereavement counselling role.
