

4-Day Summer 2012 Narrative Therapy Intensive: *Taking Narrative Ideas into Your Everyday Practice*

Limited seating for this intensive



This practice-based intensive will offer participants the opportunity to delve into the many ideas and practices that inform both narrative therapy and narrative collective practice.

The emphasis will include:

- Learning about the maps of narrative practice
- Engaging in conversations that externalize problems, re-member significant figures in people's lives, explore what is *absent but implicit*
- How to move towards preferred identity stories
- Situating problems in the broader contexts of various power relations
- Considerations of gender and culture and narrative practice
- Developing practices that support rich subordinate story development

Throughout this 4-day training program Angel will share stories of her work to illustrate narrative ideas-in-action. Experiential exercises, didactic, role-play and video clips will also guide the learning together. A half-day will include a live interview and opportunity for participants to be part of an outsider witness team.

On Day 3 of this intensive William Cooke and Margotte Kaczanowska will present a **special half-day workshop** titled ***Goodbye and Hello: Narrative Therapy and Loss***. This half-day workshop will help participants to apply the Narrative maps and practices introduced in the first two days of the summer school to the particular life situation of grief, loss and bereavement. Together, participants will become familiar with the transforming questions that Michael White described in his paper *Saying Hullo Again* as well as the important contributions to Re-membering practices of Lorraine Hedtke and John Winslade. The presenters will demonstrate ways to include the one who has died right in the consulting room

This intensive training program will benefit keen narrative beginners* and practitioners who are wishing to extend and stretch their current narrative practice. Most of all it will be relevant to anyone hoping to take narrative ideas back into their everyday practice.
